

#### **GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS HOLIDAY CHEER STAKES**

Last week's race of the week, the Cigar Mile, gave us a stone cold 30-1 Trifecta hit as the A-B-C selections filled the first three places in that order. Nothing to get too excited about but not to be sniffed at either; it was actually great value. This week's race is completely different; we are now dealing with a Tapeta sprint where at least six of the twelve runners have form good enough to hit the board.

PATCHES O'HOULIHAN may scratch from this race. If he runs he will be the best horse in the field. This is Canada's best sprinter, he is well up to G1 standard on turf and synthetics, his preferred surface seems to be Tapeta and he is as tough as racehorses come. True, he is coming off a defeat but that run, a close (and very game) runner-up effort in the Kennedy Road at Woodbine, was his best performance to date. Coming off four straight wins, he met the 2023 Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint winner Nobals and had to give him 4lbs. Nobals was back to his best, so that task became too tough. Patches O'Houlihan - as always - ran fast and hard all the way and he did not give up with out a fight. Beaten three parts of a length, while 4 1/4 lengths clear of War Bomber in third, he returned **Globeform 118** on the day, a rating that is two pounds higher than his previous best; produced when winning his two preceding races; the Vigil Stakes and the Nearctic Stakes. War Bomber was third in both of these events too, though markedly closer to Patches O'Houlihan than he was in the Kennedy, like the Holiday Cheer run over 6 furlongs. Patches O'Houlihan deserves to be favorite here but he might be a favorite in danger. Having drawn the widest post he could be hung very wide around the turn, and that seems to be the reason his trainer is thinking of bypassing this race. Patches O'Houlihan does, however, own early speed that is far superior to other prominent types in this race. Give him a decent start, and he's capable of clearing off early and get a good pitch going into the bend. None of the three directly to his inside, Dude N Colorado (11), Dream Shake (10) and Field Day (9), are quick early, while One Timer (8) and Manny Wah (7) have both been out of form recently. So this does not look at all bad for 'Patches' but it seems likely that we will wait for another day to see him in action again. >>>

#### GLOBEFORM ANALYSIS HOLIDAY CHEER STAKES

RUN CARSON, drawn in stall 3, is very interesting and will be the clear pick if Patches O'Houlihan drops out. This 3yo son of Maclean's Music, who has sired two high class dirt sprinters in Jackie's Warrior and Drain the Clock, has really turned the corner in his two most recent starts, running to Globeform 114p on both occasions. With 4lbs less than Patches O'Houlihan - and a better post position - he is well worth considering. Run Carson is coming off two excellent wins on turf, over different trips at different tracks and, perhaps most noteworthy, with such contrasting trips. After flashing speed throughout in the 5.5-furlong Carle Place Stakes at Aqueduct, where he sniffed at the track record while outclassing Live High Live Low, he overcame a startmiss to come from last to win a high quality allowance heat over 6 furlongs at Churchill Downs, finishing fast to beat stakes winner Joe Shiesty by 1 1/4 lengths. Coppola ran third and Dhabab finished fourth, beaten 4 lengths. The latter ran a much better race when he was beaten 1 1/2 lengths when second to Patches O'Houlihan in the Nearctic. That Run Carson was able to perform just as well after a bad start as he he had been when part of the early pace speaks volumes; he has absolutely thriving this fall; the one question is how will he cope with the surface switch? Seven of his eight races to date have been on turf and he has hit the board in six of them. The eighth run was on a wet dirt track, when he ran third.

**Note** that <u>Live High Live Low</u>, second to Run Carson at Aqueduct, runs in the Tropical Park Derby at Gulfstream Park on Saturday.

**MO STASH** is also coming off a career best, having run to **Globeform 111** when failing by just a neck in his attempt at giving the in-form Arrest Me Red 2lbs over 5 furlongs at Keeneland in November. Mo Stash was up with the pace from start to finish and he ran a winning race that day. Given that he took the Transylvania over 8.5 furlongs last year, there's no reason to doubt that he will be just as good over this extra furlong; provided he likes the surface. Like Run Carson, he will also be making his first start over a synthetic track. Looking at his overall form, not just his good run last time out, it's clear that **12-1 morning line is too big**. This is a form horse with speed and stamina, he has a good draw and he has a rider, Luan Machado, who won the jockeys' title at Turfway Park last winter (62 wins, 21%) and he has started off well also at this meet.

**ONE TIMER** has a fascinating record; he is 3-for-3 over synthetic tracks, yet two of his best performances to date were over the undulating turf course at Kentucky Downs. He has also won on dirt; suffice to say that he is a versatile horse. His run three starts back, when he was beaten just a head by Arrest Me Red at level weights over 6.5 furlongs at Kentucky Downs, represents form that would make him a player in this race. Arrest Me Red went on to beat **MO STASH** at Keeneland next time out. One Timer's two runs since that performance have not been all that inspiring but perhaps we should to judge them too harshly. Cogburn simply blew the field apart in the Kentucky Downs Turf Sprint, where One Timer was sixth, and One Timer was hopelessly last going down the back stretch in the Woodford at Keeneland, then ran on gamely at the finish to get up for fifth place. He's had a two-month break since and his trainer, Larry Rivelli, has a 31% strike rate with such layoff runners and his stakes clip is an impressive 36%. So yes, trifecta players will have to consider One Timer. >>>

**DREAM SHAKE**, who has won twice after long breaks in the past, has not been seen in action since early September. He has had just two starts in 2024, and he's the fresh horse in the mix. His fifth place finish in the Da Hoss Stakes at Colonial Downs three months ago was below his best level of form but his preceding performance, a strong off the pace win in the 5.5-furlong Van Clief Stakes over the same course in August, was very close to his personal best based on ratings. Dream Shake came with a fine finish to beat Witty by 3/4 length, running to GF 111, just one pound lower than his form when winning the Connaught Cup and running a close fifth in the Nearctic Stakes on turf at Woodbine last year. A good weight carrying third in the 2023 Kennedy Road confirmed that he is as efficient on the Tapeta and it's probably risky to toss him out here. But for his most recent start (when something may have been amiss) and an unplaced effort at Kentucky Downs (a course that probably didn't suit him), Dream Shake has been a very game and consistent performer over the past two seasons. A hot pace could set things up for his late charge and he is a potential Trifecta horse.

**SENBEI** ran a good race when coming from just off the pace to win the Belmont Turf Sprint over 6 furlongs at Aqueduct in October. Beating the useful yardsticks Nothing Better and Alogon by 1 1/4 lengths and 1/2 length, he improved to **Globeform 110** in the process, having returned GF 108 when running a close third to Smithwick's Spice in the Select Stakes at Monmouth Park on his preceding start (when Nothing Better was second). Senbei has raced once over a Tapeta track, performing to GF 107 to be fourth in a stakes quality allowance sprint at Woodbine last year, so the surface should probably not be a cause for concern. His most recent run might be though; he ran 12lbs below his best rating when finishing eighth to dead-heaters Alogon and Works for Me in the Turf Sprint Championship at Aqueduct just over a month ago.

**HOWARD WOLOWITZ** has been made the morning line favorite at 5-2. That seems wrong and definitely would be if Patches O'Houlihan turns up. Even without him, 5-2 looks too short for this 3yo. That's not to say he is a horse to toss out. On the contrary, Howard Wolowitz is certainly one to consider; mainly because he is the young horse who might find significant improvement. Having run to **Globeform 107p** at the Breeders' Cup, he needs to improve to have a winning chance but the way he ran in the BC Turf Sprint at Del Mar suggested that there's better to come from this son of Munnings. Howard Wolowitz was at the back of the field early, racing a bit keenly and looking immature still, was then forced wide on the turn and finished with interest coming down the lane - without being given a hard time by his rider. He passed the winning post in ninth place but was beaten no more than 3 lengths by the winner, Starlust. It's always dangerous to speculate on 'how much better he would have run with a better trip' but in this case it's reasonable to assume that Howard Wolowitz is capable of around GF 111-112. Or at least that he will be soon. He's in with a shot.
